Yukon, and there became acquainted with a Mrs.Markinson, whowas on the Yukon at that time. Mrs.Markinson is a relative of a Mr. Marden, one of the chief men of the Claude Neon Company in Sydney, and Mrs.Markinson is at present staying in Sydney with him. During the time that Miss Mackenzie and Carlyle were friendly and supposed to be engaged to be married, they were frequent visitors at the Marden's home.

Miss Mackenzie and Carlyle left Vancouver by the "Niagara" sailing from Vancouver on Wednesday the 20th June 1934.

We do not anticipate that the proceedings which have been instituted, willcome before our Court before the end of February 1935, and under these circumstances any information which you are able to let us have before that time will be extremely useful.

We again thank you for the courtesy you have extended to us in this matter, and take this opportunity of wishing you a pleasant voyage on your return to Canada.
