At the session of 1939 he introduced legislation creating a Defence Purchasing Board which shall have the responsibility of letting all defence contracts where the amount is estimated to exceed \$5,000.

Coupled with this legislation is the most drastic provision for the taxation of arms profits ever introduced in any country in the world, even in wartime.

This clause provides that where a contract has been let other than by competitive bidding, all profits in excess of 5% on the capital utilized in the work shall be taxed away.

This culminating measure to a series of progressive steps towards strict profit control indicates the continuous and earnest effort of the Minister of National Defence and the Government of which he is a member to ensure that the great sacrifices, which the people of Canada are called upon to bear in the cause of national defence, shall not be the occasion of profitmaking by a few individuals and corporations.
