Sir,-

Referring to your letter of the 13th ultimo, No. 725397, I beg to enclose herewith a copy of an Order-in-Council dated the 21st instant, transferring the S. E. $\frac{1}{4}$ of Section 4, Tp. 62, R. 2, W. 4th M., situated within the limits of the Cold Lake Indian reserve, occupied by the Roman Catholic Church as a Mission, to your Department and setting apart 177 acres, being portions of fractional S. E. $\frac{1}{4}$ of Sec. 19, R. 1, and fractional S. E. $\frac{1}{4}$ of Sec. 24, R. 2, all west of the 4th Meridian, as a reserve for the Cold Lake band of Indians and to be known as Indian reserve No. 149 A.

Enclosed herewith are the plans showing the above mentioned lands.
