Ottawa, 20th September 1916.

Sir,-

I beg to acknowledge the receipt of your letter of the 5th instant, No. 26350-6, and to inform you that it was arranged with your Department in which the present portion of the Blood Tribe River Indian reserve was to be assigned for a portion adjacent to it on the north--which which would include the tract on which the Indians have built their houses. It has not been convenient to make any map although it has been on our list for some years.

I beg to submit herewith a plan on which above is indicated with your suggestion, the limits of the proposed new reserve defined by sections or parts of sections, the one containing approximately 350 acres. This area is partitioned the same as the present one outlined.

The lands indicated on the plan are the following:- the south half Section 4 and the fractional South half Section 5 in Twp. 33, R. 6, E. P.M. and the following lands in Twp. 33, R. 6, E. P.M., Sections 34, 37 and 38; all of fractional sections excepting the portion in the island in the river, all of fractional section 33 excepting that portion of the section in the same island;
