Ottawa, 20th September 1916.

Sir,-

I beg to acknowledge the receipt of your letter of the 5th instant, No. 10230-0, and to inform you that in an arrangement was made with your Department in which the largest portion of the Blood Vein River Indian reserve was to be added for a portion adjacent to it on its north-western side which would include the tract on which the Indians have situated their houses. It has not been convenient to break the way made although it has been on our list for some years.

I beg to submit herewith a plan in which also in accordance with your suggestion, the limits of the new reserve defined by sections or parts of sections, the area containing approximately 330 acres. This area is practically the same as the reserve now contains.

The lands indicated on the plan are the following:-
the south half section 4 and the fractional south half section 5 in T₉-35, R. 6, E. 2, N. 2. and the following lands in T₉-36, R. 6, E. 2, N. 2, sections 27, 28 and 29; all of fractional section 28 excepting the portion in the island in the river; all of fractional section 29 excepting that portion of the section in the same island; the fractional
