

PROSECUTOR: (resuming examination-in-chief.)

Q.15 The next one is marked Exhibit "G", Authority for Occupation of Premises and use of Chattels, Form Q2", is that a document which you received at that time?

A.15 Yes, sir.

Q.16 And attached to that what is known as Part II, a sheet written on both sides?

A.16 Yes, sir.

Q.17 And one marked Exhibit "H", a Marching in State and Authority?

A.17 Yes, sir.

Q.18 And Exhibit "I", a form addressed to the Amenities Control Committee?

A.18 Yes, sir.

Q.19 And Exhibit "D", a notice of vacation?

A.19 Yes, sir.

Q.20 And El, Marching in State?

A.20 Yes, sir.

Q.21 And "K", a requisition form of Hirings 20(b)?

A.21 Yes, sir.

MR. GAGE:

These documents are so far not evidence.
(Documents are returned to the Prosecutor by the Court).

PROSECUTOR: (Resuming examination-in-chief.)

Q.22 Now, following your visit to the Town Major's office where next did you go?

A.22 I proceeded, sir, to the offices of the Banking Firm of Orontius in Sarphatistraat, Amsterdam where I saw one Mr. Van Dam. He produced his records concerning property in Amsterdam for which he is the agent. It was a ledger, sir, and in this ledger was a sheet referring to the house at Oranje Nassaulaan 59. This sheet from the ledger was handed to me by Mr. Van Dam.

Q.23 I now show you a sheet marked "M". Is that the sheet which you obtained at that time?

A.23 That is the sheet, sir.
(Document is marked "M" for identification.)

JUDGE ADVOCATE:

That is marked only for identification.

PROSECUTOR: (Resuming examination-in-chief.)

Q.24 And what was the next act which you did in the course of your investigation?

A.24 On 15th January, sir, at Apollolaan 125 I saw Capt. Bradshaw.
