I examined the seven one pound notes produce by Pte Smyth and amongst them I found three which bore the consecutive serial numbers, they were, 2114781132, 2114781133, 2114781134. I asked Pte Smyth how he came in possession of these notes and he said that he had won them in a game. I placed Pte Smyth under close arrest and informed him that I would have to charge him.

The accused declines to cross-examine the witness.

4th witness - E-183135 Pte Mills J. Having been duly sworn states: I am Pte Mills G.H. of Gp H.L. 8 Cdn Inf Bde Sp Gp (C.H. of G.). On Pay Parade on 21 Oct, 45 I drew six one pound notes from the Paymaster. The serial numbers of these notes are, 2114781115, 1116, 1117, 1118, 1119, 1120. I drew my pay immediately prior to Pte Mills, but cannot state where Cpl MacCallum was in the Pay Parade.

The accused declines to cross-examine the witness. *Henrichs*

5th witness - G-21058 Pte Milne G.H. having been duly sworn states: I am G-21058 Pte Milne G.H. of Gp H.L. 8 Cdn Inf Bde Sp Gp (C.H. of G.). On Pay Parade on 21 Oct, 45, I received my pay immediately after Pte Mills. I drew eleven one pound notes, the numbers which I now have are, 2114781121, 1122, 1123, 1124, 1125, 1126, 1127, 1128, 1129. The remaining two pounds I have spent. Cpl MacCallum was behind me in the line but I cannot state whether or not his name was called after mine.

The accused declines to cross-examine the witness. *Henrichs*

6th witness - E-77339 Pte Scanlon M. having been duly sworn states - I am E-77339 Pte Scanlon M. of "A" Coy 8 Cdn Inf Bde Sp Gp (C.H. of G.) on Friday 23 Oct, 45, I took part in a "Crab Game" in which Pte Smyth was also playing, at that time Pte Smyth won some money, I think about two pounds. On Saturday 23 Oct, 45 I took part in a further game along with Pte Smyth and some other men, at this time Pte Smyth won further money, I believe about two pounds ten shillings.

The accused declines to cross-examine the witness. *M Scanlon*

7th witness - Capt G.H. Wilson having been duly sworn states: I am Capt G.H. Wilson, Brigade Paymaster for 8 Cdn Inf Bde M.C.

The Field Cashier issued me with the following notes, serials, 2114781001 to 2000 inclusive. These notes were used on Pay Parade for 8 Cdn Inf Bde Sp Gp (C.H. of G.) on 21 Oct, 45. To the best of my knowledge they were paid out in numerical sequence on the Pay Parade.

Q.1. If I came in with some 10 shilling notes to be exchanged for one pound notes would you do so?

A.1. Yes I would.

Q.2. Then in that way it would be possible that these could be some notes of the sequence passed out between the paying of two consecutive men on Pay Parade.

A.2. That could be possible.
