practically no white population and very few Indians, probably 20 of the latter.

From mile 280 there are quite a number of settlers taking up land in the Lower Nechaeco valley and north of, and in the vicinity of Ft. George. Including Ft. George, there are probably 1,500 white population. Around Ft. Fraser, Fort St. James, Fort McLeod and vicinity there are probably 20 white men and 200 Indians. No other settlers are found until the Peace River country is reached, where quite a number of homesteaders are living, and some halfbreeds. Probably there are not over 3,000 people on the whole line, including Indians, but the territory is capable of supporting a large population when transportation is furnished and it will settle up very quickly thereafter.
