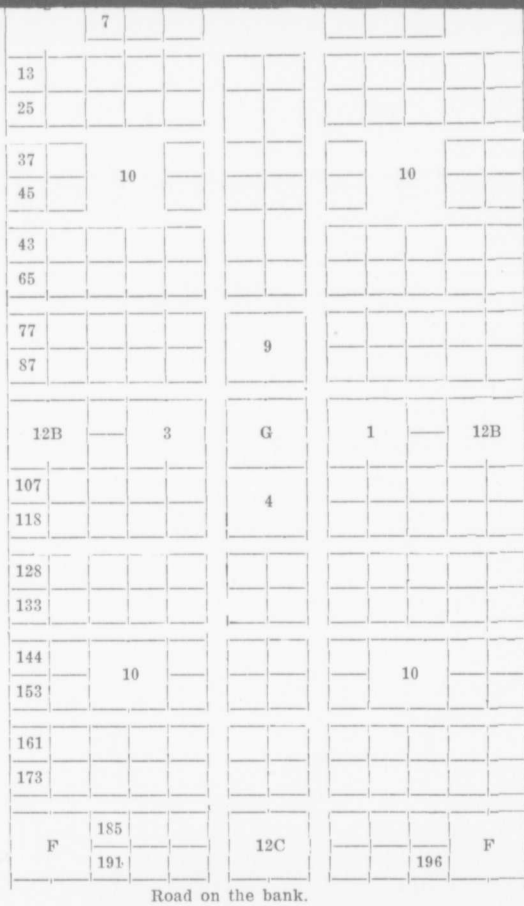

TOWN PLOT IN NEW SETTLEMENT.



- 1—A place for the public worship of God, being a square containing about 4 acres.
- 2—Common burying ground, about 4 acres each.
- 3—Parsonage house, etc., 4 acres.
- 4—Common schoolhouse and workhouse, 4 acres.
- 7—Glebe for minister, 72 acres.
- 8—Glebe for schoolmaster, 72 acres.
- 9—Court or town house and prison, 4 acres.
- 10—Public squares, 4 acres.
- 12A—Green market, 4 acres.
- 12B—2 meat markets, 4 acres each.
- 12C—Fish market place, 4 acres.
- F—Two squares for hospitals, 4 acres each.
- G—Public square or parade, 4 acres in the centre of the town.
- H—Town park for a schoolmaster, 24 acres.
- J—Town park for a minister, 24 acres.

- The streets are taken off some of the town lots. The 8 principal streets are 96 feet wide. All the others 60 feet wide. All the public squares open at the angles.
