On week evenings—General Prayer-meeting, Wednesday, at 7.30; Female, on Thursday, at 7.30; Bible Readings, Friday, at 7.30; Monthly Concert of Prayer for Missions the first Monday in each month; S. S. Teacher's meeting after the Wednesday evening prayer-meeting; Woman's Mission Circle, the last Thursday evening in each month.

For Business.—Regular Quarterly Church Meetings, the first Friday in January, April, July and October.—The July quarterly being the Annual Meeting. A special business meeting may be called, at any time, by the officers of the church, or at the written request of any five members of the church. All strictly business meetings should be announced on a Sabbath previous. Twelve members shall constitute a quorum; but when business of importance is transacted, it is desirable to have a full meeting. Candidates for baptism may be received at the Wednesday evening or Sabbath meetings of the church.

ST. BONIFACE COLLEGE.

A school established in 1818, and incorporated as a college in 1871.

Rev. J. N. Provencher, who was afterwards elected first Bishop of St. Boniface, opened the first regular school in the country in 1818, in his own residence. Having hardly room enough for himself in his small house, he, nevertheless, gathered Half-breed children, and taught them reading and writing. Some of his scholars were even taught classics, and with such success that Rev.

S. J. N. Dumoulin, in a letter dated March 10th, 1824, and lately republished, could state, "that several children were already advanced in humanities."
