

MISCELLANEOUS.

FROM HAVANA, JUNE 13.—We learn from Capt. Ward of bark Rapid, arrived at this port Monday, that the trial of the prisoners taken at Woman's Island, was still going on on board of the Spanish 74 lying in the Port. A large number of gun boats were kept rowing around her to prevent any persons from communicating with her. The U.S. Consul, Mr. Campbell and Commander Randolph asked permission to see the persons confined on board, but the authorities refused to allow them to hold any communication with them, stating that they would be tried by the laws of Maritime nations and if found guilty, they should be dealt with accordingly. There has been several deaths among the persons confined on board of the 74 gun ship. The captains and crew of the bark Georgia and brig Susan Lound, were kept in confinement on board of the same vessel with those that were taken off Woman's Island. There had been several persons arrested and put in prison, and their property confiscated, on suspicion of being concerned in the invasion of Gen. Lopez. The U.S. ships of war Albany and Germantown were lying off and on before the harbour waiting orders. It was the opinion of the American Consul that should the U.S. Government demand the release of the persons taken off Woman's Island they would be given up without further trouble.

The sickness among the shipping at Havana has entirely subsided; but there were a few cases among the blacks. Dr. Pierson, a native of Elizabethtown (N. J.), died on the 11th June, after a few hours' sickness.—New York Journal of Commerce June 20.

FROM SANTA CRUZ, CUBA, MAY 28.—We learn from Capt. Baker, of the brig Jesse, that the news of the landing of Gen. Lopez's expedition at Cardenas caused a great excitement at the port for several days. All kinds of reports were entirely suspended, and all the male inhabitants were called on by the commander of the port to arm themselves in defence of the city. The militia were daily drilled, and a constant patrol was kept up for several nights and days, but the news of the defeat of the patriots having been received a few days after by the authorities, caused a great rejoicing among the inhabitants by the ringing of church bells and celebrating in the churches. A few days previous to the sailing of Captain Baker, the Militia were disbanded, and business began to flow through its proper channel.—Id.

FROM POINT PETRE, GUADALOUPE, JUNE 7.—We learn from Capt. Gibbs, of the brig Richmond, that he received a letter from Mr. J. A. Fisher, from Ponce, the U.S. Consul at Point Petre, stating that the negroes had attempted to set up an insurrection at that place. They commenced firing the city in several places, at one time and at one place, near the centre of the city, 130 houses were consumed, and at the north side of the city there were fifty houses burnt. The Governor immediately sent to Martinique for assistance, and about 200 troops had arrived, and the city was put under martial law. The last accounts received at Ponce from Point Petre, the government had succeeded in putting the negroes down, but not until they had shot several of the ringleaders.—Id.

FROM MATANZAS, JUNE 6.—We learn from Capt. Merrill, of the bark Archimedeo, that the harbour of Matanzas was strictly garrisoned by a large number of gun-boats, each having a large swivel mounted on the stern. The Militia were daily drilled on the Plaza. The Government is making great effort to prevent another landing of the Patriots.
