Mr. President, and Honorable Gentlemen of the Legislative Council; Mr. Speaker, and Gentlemen of the House of Assembly;

I have called you together, in obedience to the instructions of Her Majesty's Principal Z_{-} Secretary of State for the Colonies, in order to give you an opportunity to determine whether you will appoint an Agent to represent the Legislature of Nova Scotia, at the Bar of the Privy Council, in the case now pending before the Judicial Committee, regarding the legality of the annexation of the Island of Cape Breton to this Province, in 1820.
