of the poor have suffered much, and unless aid is obtained from some quarter, their state will be desperate.

We asked of the Government last Fall some assistance to settle those people on Crown Lands at the head of the Digdeguash River, and to be repaid by them in the same manner as the Harvey settlers have done. If this had been complied with very much evil and expense would have been avoided.
