CHICAGO, May 27.—Wheat averaged higher today, helped by a big increase in the world's available supply. The market closed firm at the same as last night to 1 cent advance. In corn the outcome varied from 1/2c decline to 1 1/2c gain, oats finished 1-8c up to 1-16c, soybeans, and provisions with a rise of 1/2c to 1 1/2c.

WOODSTOCK BEATS BERLIN WOBBLES
Retaliate for Saturday's Loss by Beating Dutchmen
WOODSTOCK, May 28—Woodstock's Wobbly baseball team got even yesterday afternoon with the Berlin aggregation for the walloping administered to the local crew by the team of that city on Saturday. The locals won over the Dutchmen by a score of 7 to 1. Manager Bradley's outfit put yesterday's game on ice in the second innings when they hammered Cochrane, the visitor's slab artist for six hits, each being turned into a run. Throughout the contest the home team walloped the ball for nine safeties, and on the other hand Coose on the mound for Woodstock kept the Berlin hits well scattered and was backed up by some clever fielding. Woodstock presented a changed line up yesterday, using Galway at first and Weidmann, a new one, at second. The change worked well, and the fielding was snappy throughout. The game was called at the first half of the eighth.

A Modern Cement Stucco House
DESIGNED BY CHAS. S. SEDGWICK, ARCHITECT.
This design is that of a house having a broad frontage of 26 feet and a depth of 31 feet, exclusive of front piazza which is 10 feet in width. This house is liberal in proportions, convenient in arrangement, having the central hall feature of the colonial houses, with a large living room on the right 14 by 22 feet and dining room on the left, 12 by 17 feet opening opposite across the central hall with wide columned arches, giving a very roomy and liberal appearance. The vestibule entrance has glazed doors with side lights affording ample light to the central hall, the main stairs extending up from the rear of same. In the center of this hall is a recessed seat with mirror and coat hooks on each side, making a convenient and attractive coat closet. The living room is liberal in size with a wide fireplace in the center of a projected bay at the side and with wide triple windows in front and rear. The basement stairs extend down from the kitchen under the main stairs with a rear grade entrance. This main floor is finished in Mission oak with oak floor. The second story has four good-sized chambers each provided with ample closets and convenient bath room on the left between the front and rear chamber. The stairs to the attic extend up over the main stairs, this attic space is large and roomy for storage purposes, and two small rooms may be finished if desired. The finish of the second story is in white enamel with birch floor. The roof is treated in "gambrel" form with front and rear dormer windows lighting the chambers and also windows in the gable ends. The general treatment of the exterior is colonial, with wide front and the roof brought out with a sweep over the front piazza. The exterior walls are cemented on metal lath. All of the wood trimmings, chaises, cornices, etc., painted white and the roof shingles stained green. It is estimated to build this house exclusive of heating and plumbing for \$4,200 to \$5,000. There is a good full basement under the house and everything about the plan to make a complete, up-to-date arrangement.
