HUN SCOUT SHIPS NOW OUT AT SEA

Some of Them Have Set Sail From Zeebrugge.

Amsterdam, Feb. 13.—The Telegram says the German scout vessels in the North Sea are believed to have gone out of Zeebrugge, as it is known that some vessels which formerly were not at that port have been lying there under steam. The British mine sweepers gave a good account of themselves when they were attacked and inflicted damage on three of the enemy. In the battle that followed the German attacks, one of the British ships was separated from its companions, and has not been accounted for. It is understood that this vessel is the "Cruiser" which Berlin identified as the "Cruiser Arabis," stating that it was sunk by a torpedo. The naval expert of the Daily Chronicle thinks that "the answer" is to be found in the fact that the British warship Arabis is an unusual type of vessel, which might easily be mistaken for something else. She is an oil-driven vessel. A number of ships of this class began to appear on the high seas in recent years. In addition to the British ship Arabis, another British vessel was sunk by a German submarine in the North Sea, according to an official Admiralty report given out in Berlin last night. The report which is forwarded by publication by the Admiralty reports, relative to the sinking of the British cruiser Arabis, that a second English ship was sunk, which was hit by a torpedo. A German torpedo boat rescued the commander of the Arabis, also the surgeon, one officer, one non-commissioned officer and twenty-seven men. During the return, however, the surgeon and three men died because of long exposure in the sea.

London, Feb. 15.—An Austro-Hungarian air squadron to-day tried to blow up the train bearing Premier Briand of France. M. Leon Bourgeois is Minister without portfolio in the French cabinet, and other leaders of the French cabinet are reported to have taken a conference with King Victor Emmanuel at his headquarters at the front.

Only meagre despatches have been allowed through. These merely state that it is believed in Rome the exclusive object of the raid was to wreck the train which dropped bombs in Milan, the second largest city in Italy, according to news reaching here. Six persons are reported to have been killed and several wounded. Three other large cities, Treviso, Bergamo and Brescia, also were visited.

An official announcement issued in Rome says that at Monsa, within a few miles of Milan, the explosive chaplet erected on the spot where the late King Humbert was assassinated was struck by a bomb. One man was killed and five wounded.

The following sentence is attached to the end of a despatch from Milan to The Daily News: "The famous Milan Cathedral escaped unscathed."

The cathedral is within a few hundred yards of the Royal Palace. The official report, after citing the Monsa incident, says: "Two incendiary bombs were dropped near Treviso and three at Bergamo, but no damage was done. At Brescia six Austrian aeroplanes were tempted to fly over the city, but driven off by anti-aircraft guns and recrossed the frontier."

The Daily News despatch telling of the damage done at Ravenna says: "Only a fifteenth century facade of the Basilica St. Apollinare at Ravenna was injured by the Austrian venna was injured by the Austrian bombardment. The precious mosaics adorning the church, which was built by Theodoric, King of the Goths, in the sixth century, were unharmed."

RUSSIA, REGENERATED, UNTIL WEATHER ALL

Whole Machinery of Government Corrupt and Inefficient Official All Formalities Known as Minimum.

THE GREAT CHANGE An Associated Press correspondent who left Russia when its military fortunes were at the lowest ebb, with its provisions and munitions inadequately provisioned and its government corrupt and inefficient management, not only defeating the chances of military achievement for the moment, but creating a spirit of uneasiness and criticism among the people which threatened national solidarity, returned to find the country thoroughly reorganized.
