### CAMPAIGN MEETING

Though Friday evening last was characterized by the roughest weather of the season, a large number braved the elements to attend the meeting held in the town hall to discuss the High School By-Law. Reeve Holmes presided and with him on the platform were Messrs Geo. Howard Ferguson, M.L.A. of Kemptville, Rev. W. G. Swayne, W. G. Parish and J. H. Sexton, M.A.

Mr Parish, in a brief speech, traced the history of the school from its early beginning, and claimed that the present arrangement with the counties council and the Education Department was the best obtainable, and of the By-Law,

Rev W. G. Swayne presented the financial aspects of the question in a clear light, quoting figures that had been carefully compiled showing that the Athens High School District stands to gain very materially bringing the school building up to an approved standard.

Mr Ferguson, on being introduced, received a hearty welcome, and for an hour he held the close attention of all while he discussed, on broad national lines the importance of education to the state. It is the educated man that dominates in every department of government, and it was the duty of Ontario, the premium province of the Dominion, to so educate an entire citizenry her boys and girls that they will be able to carry out Canadian ideals in every part of the new provinces where many of them are settling among foreigners. Turning to the question at issue in respect to the high school, he said the Athens High School had a provincial reputation for high-class work and that taxpayers of the district should think twice before they make any movement to retard its advancement or force it into a lower grade. The present government was determined to raise the standard of education, and an attempt to thwart their policy in this district would be followed by decreased grants. The government could not and would not legislate for individual schools—the law and regulations were and would continue to be province-wide in their application.

On concluding his excellent address, Mr Ferguson was presented with a hearty vote of thanks, to which he made fitting acknowledgement.

At intervals during the evening high-class vocal numbers were rendered by Mrs S. C. A. Lamb and Messrs Longman and Haynes, Miss Nellie Earl presiding at the piano very efficiently.

However the vote may go on Friday next, residents of this district cannot complain of not having had an opportunity of learning the merits of the question. At the meeting on Friday evening opposition speakers were invited to the platform, but there was no response.
