#### A Big Railroad Fails.

A Rig Railroad Fails.

New York, Dec. 25.—The Atchison, Topeka and Santa Fe Railway, controlling the largest single railroad system in the world, went into the hands of the receivers at 5 o'clock yesterday afternoon. It comprises 9,300 miles. Its bankruptoy brings the total of railroad receiverships this year to the appalling total of 31,800 miles, or nearly one sixth of all the railroad mileage in the country. In the two years past more than 30 per cont of the whole American railroad mileage has gone into bankruptcy. A great deal of the Atchison stock is held in Boston, and in Europe. Europe.

Big Flood at Brampton.

Brampton, Dec. 25.—This town has had many flods, but the present one beats them all. The ice today was borne dewn to the bridge at Main street, and formed a jam there. The water backed up, and at the time of writing is five feet deep on the main thoroughfare. All the cellars in the vicinity and many of the lower stories of the houses are filled with water. The occupants are living upstairs. Some men are doing a thriving business rescuing people in rowboats. A rushing torrent is surging over Queen street, and those who wanted to celebrate Christmas in the Wellington Hotel had to proceed there on a raft.

To add to the inconvenience of the citizens the town is in darkness. The gasworks are flooded and much damage has been done. The clectric lights have also gone wrong, and the people are groping around with lanterns. Big Flood at Brampton.


