

## Baby Welfare Week Begins Thursday

Will Be Very Entertaining Affair;  
Many Prominent People Will  
Lecture

Preparations are now being made by the committee headed by Mrs. Harold Riley, to make Baby Welfare Week one of the most auspicious ones in Calgary's history.

The plans that are now in process of completion includes the usual publicity work through the newspapers to acquaint the people with the work of the association and the needs for careful attention of the raising of children.

Public demonstrations will be made through a series of entertainments where public speakers will lecture on the subject giving mothers and others careful advice regarding proper children's welfare.

More and more is the world coming to the thought that baby welfare is an important subject, one that should be adhered to and adopted by all lovers of healthy children.

The slogan "Save the Babies" is a new one adopted by the members of the association some time ago and ably expresses the fundamental principles and aims of the order.

The meetings will be held at the Central Methodist church, and many well known speakers including Dr. Mahood will address the women on this important subject.

A special film entitled "Birth" will be shown at the Regent theater on Thursday afternoon. This picture, which is very interesting, has been seen in eastern Canada, but has never been shown at any theater in Alberta.

The committee has 400 tickets which will be given to those who attend the meetings prior to that afternoon. There will be many exhibits of interest depicting the proper care of children, in their clothing, feeding, bathing and exercising. The city is also having an exhibit of supervised playgrounds. A considerable quantity of literature will be given away, and bulletins and panels will emphasize the necessity of conserving the child life of the nation.

Refreshments will be served by the Local Council of Women every afternoon at the church and a musical program under the direction of Mrs. A. M. Grogan will be part of every meeting. It is the committee's plan to keep every meeting to the shortest time limit possible, and no speaker will talk for any great length of time. Those asked to speak are all well known experts in their line, and every address should be replete with useful information.


