The following is from the Toronto Telegram:

IN DRIVING FINISHES.

Favorites Fared Badly Yesterday at H.J.C.

John E. McMillen Beat Moquette.

Great Suburban Handicap To-day.

The rain storm early yesterday afternoon affected the attendance at the Hamilton Jockey Club course and made the main track sloppy and slow. Considering the weather the attendance was large for the second day, over 2,000 being present. About 400 regulars came on the Toronto special, and the speculation was fairly brisk. It was a bad day for the talent, only two first choices catching the judges' eye first. Driving

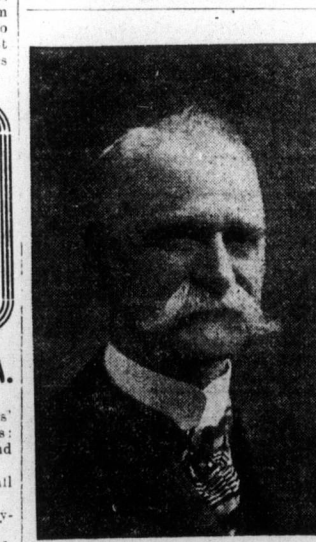


CAPT. GORDON HENDERSON, Director of the H.J.C., and One of the Stewards of the Present Meeting.

finishes, however, were the rule, and the racing for the most part was as keen as the most fastidious could wish for. The beaten favorites were Alice George, in the first; Autumn Girl, in the second; Moquette, in the fourth; Moonraker, in the fifth, and Spanish Prince in the seventh. The two choices to land were Bellwether and Tourney.

The feature event of the card was the Hotel Royal Handicap at a mile and a furlong, with \$800 added, and was reduced to a field of three on account of the changed conditions of the track from the previous day. The three left were Moquette, Donald McDonald and John E. McMillen. The race was a good one, however. Moquette set a fast pace to the three-quarter pole, and was closely followed by McMillen. Coming into the stretch McMillen moved up and the pair raced as a team to the wire. In the hardest kind of a drive on the part of Kennedy McMillen pushed in front by a head. Kennedy was applauded for his brilliant ride. Goldstein was warned by the judges to be more careful in future, he having bore out on the winner in the stretch.

Another good race was the event of

Canadian bred at three-quarters of a mile. There was a big field in this, the only scratch being French Shore, Cecil Rhodes and the heavily weighted horse, Glimmer. The last horse to get away was Fort Garry, but he was second at the finish, and was beaten only by his stable companion, Annie Maid. Jockey Mentry kept at him all the way, and in spite of the handicap of his bad beginning, tried to beat Annie Maid in the last strides. The rider of the winner, J. McIntyre, carried Cape Sauce wide in the stretch, and repeated his manner of allowing his mount to run wild in the event.

The first disqualification and the first run-up came with the running of the sixth race, which went to Walker's excellent mudder, Bellwether. The latter won handily. The race had selling conditions and Bellwether was entered at \$10,000. When put up for sale L. C. Shobe, whose Cloisteress finished second, boosted Bellwether to \$10,000. Walker protected the horse with the usual advance of \$5 and retained him at \$10,000. Sir Edward, who finished third, was dis-

qualified for crossing over in front of Hiako at the sixteenth pole. The latter was coming strong at the time and might have beaten out Sir Edward. The stewards evidently took this view of the matter, for they promptly allowed the claim of foul that Kennedy made. McIntyre, who rode Sir Edward, was set down for the rest of the week.

The jumping race brought out a field of six. It was over the short course, and there were two mishaps. At the first jump Villahella fell and rolled over on Jockey Pender. He was attended by Dr. Morris and soon came to sufficiently to walk to the dressing room. At the fourteenth jump Wuerzburger lost his rider. Tourney, the favorite, won pulled up, after leading nearly all the way, but being pressed at times by Student King, the second horse to pass under the wire.

HEARD IN THE PADDOCK.

"Red" Walker announced this morning that he contemplated retiring from the turf. He has priced both Bellwether and Stanley Ray to Joseph E. Seagram, and the deal is likely to be consummated within the next few days. Walker has purchased a farm near Uxbridge, and it is his intention to retire from active racing for a time. He will retain a few mares and also Earl Rogers, and will keep up his interest in the sport by breeding a few horses.

Jockey Dalton left for New York to join the stable of F. A. Forsythe. McCarthy has entered into an arrangement to ride for the latter for the balance of the season.

Jockey Stone was fined \$25 by Starter Dade for trying to beat the flag in the jumping race.

The newspaper men got their in the new open press box. They were kept busy dodging the rain, being obliged to do most of their work on their knees under the grand stand.

The Thirteenth Band will play on Saturday afternoon.

Jockeys Kennedy, Ross and Brooks were set down for the rest of the week by Starter Dade for disobedience at the post.
