BURNING OF A COTTON MILL AT FALL RIVER

FALL RIVER, MASS., Sept. 21

Once more has New England been called upon to mourn in consequence of another appalling calamity and one that has not alone involved the destruction of a vast amount of property, but also brought with it death or suffering to nearly fifty people, and filled twice that number of homes with grief and bereavement.

Today the enterprising and prosperous city of Fall River is bowed in sorrow, and signs of pity and mourning are depicted upon the countenances of her citizens, while the only theme of conversation heard on the streets and in public places is that of the terrible devastation which has visited that municipality.

Yesterday morning the hundreds of operatives, as usual, assembled in the various departments at the Granite Cotton Mill No. 1, which is located, on Twelfth and Bedford streets, and the thought that the weeks toil would soon close cheered the old and middle-aged, while smiles of anticipated pleasure gladdened the faces of the young.

The factory bell at last gave the signal to begin the days work, the great engines were set in motion, and soon after the hum of the thousands of spindles and other machinery in the establishment proclaimed that the operations of the day had begun.

A few minutes afterwards the scene of happiness and industry was changed to that of terror and despair.

Above the din of the machinery arose the alarm cry of fire, and these on the lower stories hurriedly left their places and ran into the street.

Dense volumes of black smoke were seen pouring out from the windows of the sixth story, from the apartment termed by the employers as the mule room.

In the meantime an alarm was given from box No. 7, and before it could be repeated, ten minutes valuable time was lost, and the flames, fed by the combustible and inflammable matter, swept through the entire length of the mule room ere the Fire Department reached the ground.
