



their wood is comparatively soft; and, on the other hand, hard pine and yew belong with the "softwoods" although their wood is much harden than that of the "hardwoods" just mentioned

The usage prevailing in the forest services both federal and provincia in Canada (and the same may be said of those of the United States) is to apply the term "hardwood" to a tree that bears leaves, such as the maple, oak and ash, as distin guished from those trees having needleftike foliage, such as pine and spruce, or scale-like foliage such as the cedar, which are termed "softwoods."

VITALITY MAKE NO MISTAKE SCOTT'S MILS BUILDS TRENGTH

These latter are often described as "evergreens" though the tamarack, which is a softwood sheds its foliage in the autumn, and the madrona in British Columbia, which is a hardwood, keeps its foliage all winter. Nor is the term "conifer" or cone-bearing tree, altogether satisfactory: the fruit of the yew (another softwood) has the external appearance of a berry. The
