Steel has now been laid through the first tunnel of the mountain Steel has now been laid through the first tunnel of the mountain division of the Grand Trunk, according to latest advice received in Edmonton from Fitzhugh. For three months the pioneer rested at Fitzhugh while the tunnel boring was in progress. Last week it commenced to move forward again and the steel-head is now at Mile 119, six miles west of Fitzhugh. About the end of next week steel laying will be completed to Mile 126, or the summit, at the British Columbia boundary line.
