BRIAND CONGRATULATED.

PARIS, Oct. 1. M. Venizelos, ex-Premier of Greece, and Vice-Admiral Coundouriotis have telegraphed Premier Briand congratulating him on the recent French successes.

GREECE AND THE WAR.

ATHENS, Oct. 1. Notwithstanding persistent rumors by the adherents of former Premier Venizelos and the Entente that King Constantine is merely playing for time and does not intend to declare war, those close to the King are confident that he will telegraph his decision to King George, Emperor Nicholas and President Poincare on Monday at the latest.

BELGIAN OFFICIAL.

HAVRE, Oct. 1. The Belgian official weekly review says that an artillery duel was renewed with great violence during the past week in the region of Dixmude, north of which place Belgian guns of all calibre furiously engaged the German batteries.

IN MACEDONIA.

LONDON, Oct. 1. A British official issued to-night concerning fighting in Macedonia, says: On the Dolran front our army has been active.

THE RUSSIAN OFFENSIVE.

PETROGRAD, Oct. 1. The Russian drive at Lemberg was renewed yesterday, after a period of comparative quiet.

LEATHER REQUISITIONED.

LONDON, Sept. 30. The Government, according to the Shoe and Leather Journal, has requisitioned all British sole and upper leather for military purposes.

LONDON, Oct. 1. The British steamer Maywood, 1,188 tons, have been sunk and the crew saved.
