

Drowning Fatality at Flatrock.

SCHOONER CUTS DOWN MOTOR BOAT.

A tragedy which cast a gloom over the settlement of Flatrock, occurred yesterday at noon, when Mr. Thomas Hickey, youngest son of Mr. Patrick Hickey, lost his life on the fishing grounds. From what could be ascertained it appears that the young man, who was with his brothers Michael and Patrick, left in their motor boat to haul their trawls on White's Ledge, about 3 miles off the land. Arriving at the grounds the motor boat was anchored and left in charge of Thomas, whilst the two brothers took a small punt and started to beach their lines. The weather was clear and fine, with a moderate breeze blowing, when at noon the schooner "The Freedom," bound from this port to Twillingate with salt and petroleum oil cargo, bearing down on the anchored motor boat. Michael Hickey immediately shouted to the crew of the schooner to "Hard down," but it is believed the helmsman misunderstood what he said as the helm was placed "Hard up" with the result the vessel struck the boat near the engine room, cutting it in two, and forcing it under the water. At the time of the collision the schooner was making about 8 knots, and it is believed that young Hickey was killed as the impact as he was never seen after the accident. A careful search was made for the body by the heartbroken brothers of the victim, as well as by the crew of the Freedom, but without avail, the only thing being part of the motor boat. This was brought to Flatrock by the schooner. Head Constable Byrne went to the settlement during the evening and took depositions of the schooner's crew as well as that of the Hickey brothers. The fishermen of Flatrock went out in their motor boats and made a thorough search for the body, but were unsuccessful. Deceased who was 20 years of age, leaves a father, mother, two brothers and a sister to whom the sudden and unexpected passing of their dear one comes as a severe blow.

Saved From Drowning.

A PLUCKY RESCUE.

A very plucky act was witnessed at Long Pond yesterday afternoon, shortly after 4 o'clock, when Lawrence Hickey of Belvidere St., almost fully clad, swam to the rescue of John Lawlor, son of Michael Lawlor, H.M.C. The young man Lawlor was attempting to swim across the Pond, and when nearly half way over he became exhausted owing to a strong wind making a heavy top towards the centre of the pond. A number of young men who were on the bank hearing Lawlor shout for help called to Hickey who was in the woods close by dressing himself. Although having all his clothes on except his coat, Hickey plunged at once and after a hard swim reached the spot where Lawlor was. The latter had gone under but when he came to the surface Hickey caught him by the arm. The drowning young man now grasped his rescuer by the throat thus rendering him powerless. Making clear Hickey managed to get him and Lawlor with his free arm started swimming towards the shore. In the struggle Hickey's clothes were partly torn off and getting entangled in his legs made it almost impossible for him to move. Meanwhile John Lawlor seeing that both men would likely drown had divested himself of his clothes and plunging in reached them at the edge of the overfall. Lawlor and Hickey both exhausted were dragged ashore after a few minutes Hickey who is a laborer deserves recognition for his bravery in going to the rescue as he was in winter weight underwear and heavy tweed pants. His prompt action undoubtedly saved the life of the young man Lawlor. Daily he should receive distinction for his courageous action.

Obituary.

JAMES DAVIS.

The death took place, yesterday, at the residence of his son, 49 Alexander Street, after a tedious illness, of James Davis, Tanner, a native of Picton, Nova Scotia. The deceased came to this country 37 years ago and worked for some time in the Tannery, this city, later going to St. John's, where he worked with the late C. Archibald, where he worked until his health forced him to retire. He married the General. He had some 10 children, but was later discharged from the army, and has since been a patient sufferer, until the end came, calmly and peacefully. Mr. Davis was twice married, both wives having preceded him. Left to mourn their sad loss are four sons, Thomas, Louis and Ernest of this city, and Ernest residing in Halifax; also two daughters, Mrs. John Pinner, Bay Roberts, and Mrs. Eva, residing here. Interment will take place to-morrow afternoon, at 2 o'clock, at St. John's.
