These Turnip Tops were purchased mostly from farmers in the Mount Pearl district and are now on the market under the name of "Mount Pearl Turnip Greens." It took 41/2 lbs. of fresh turnip greens to fill each can, and as the retail price is 35c., they come really cheaper than early spring greens, in addition to which they are already thosoughly cleandd and only have to be heated to be ready for the table.
