MR. WARREN, THE YOUNGEST

The Premier of Newfoundland has a double distinction. He is the younges Cominion Premier in the Empire, and he is a grandson of a member of the Newfoundland, This was the first asembly of the sort to sit in a colony. But 44 years of age, Mr. Warren is slight, very short, fair, clean-shaven with humorous twinkling eyes and a firm, but mobile mouth.

He entered political life very young When he first took his seat in the Newundland House he was little more than a boy-23 to be exact-but he was already a barrister with some reputation as a speaker. Seven years later he was elected Speaker of the House of Assembly, the youngest Speaker ever to hold office.

Mr. Warren's father, like most New oundlanders, held in high esteem the education of the Old Country. When his son had passed some years at Bishop Feild College, St. John's, he packed him off to England, where he matriculated at London University in 1897, and five years later entered the legal profession in Newfoundland.
