Sportsman of Newfoundland

MR. WARREN, THE YOUNGEST PREMIER OF OUR DOMINIONS.

(By HON VICTOR GORDON, High Commissioner for Newfoundland)

The Premier of Newfoundland has a double distinction. He is the youngest Dominion Premier in the Empire, and he is a grandson of a member of the first Legislative Assembly set up in Newfoundland. This was the first assembly of the sort to sit in a colony.

But 44 years of age, Mr. Warren is slight, very short, fair, clean-shaven, with humorous twinkling eyes and a firm, but mobile mouth.

He entered political life very young. When he first took his seat in the Newfoundland House he was little more than a boy—23 to be exact—but he was already a barrister with some reputation as a speaker. Seven years later he was elected Speaker of the House of Assembly, the youngest Speaker ever to hold office.

Mr. Warren's father, like most Newfoundlanders, held in high esteem the education of the Old Country. When his son had passed some years at Bishop Feild College, St. John's, he packed him off to England, where he matriculated at London University in 1897, and five years later entered the legal profession in Newfoundland.

PLAYS THE GAME.

He soon won recognition for his debating capacity, his knowledge of public matters, and the manly spirit in which he "played the game."

For Mr. Warren is essentially a sportsman. In his younger days he won distinction as a footballer and a cricketer, and of late years he has won so much distinction at golf that for four years he was champion of the Colony. One of his first engagements in this country was a "tour" on a famous course near Town.

As the shipping clerk's wife Helene Chadwick is said to duplicate the success she achieved in "Dangerous Curve Ahead," and other big Goldwyn productions, Claire Windsor, who was the leading woman in "Grand Larceny," and who will be seen in Marshall Neilan's next production, "The Strangers' Banquet," is the other wife. Pat O'Malley is seen as the shipping clerk and Norman Kerry as the manager.

Education of Children

London Daily Telegraph—Socially and intellectually there is between our present condition and that of half a century ago a great gulf fixed. To take one point, children are very differently handled, and are supposed to require an absolute different cultivation. In the nineteenth century, and especially, perhaps, the earlier part of it, children were either neglected or, more usually, surrounded with restrictions and conditions which fatally crushed all independence. Now there is a regular cult of the children, who enjoy advantages which their forefathers never possessed, and are treated with a care and consideration and deference which make them in some cases almost tyrants of the household. But everyone gladly recognizes that the change has been beneficial, and the only doubt is whether in the freedom of a modern age children are not practically bereft of spiritual culture.
