

## Bullet Proof Glass Saves Seller's Life

DETROIT, Mich., Nov. 18 .- Bullet proof glass saved not only several thousand dollars for the Monterey Avenue branch of the American State Bank, but also saved the life of Clarence Bossow, the bookkeeper when a trio of robbers attempted to hold up the bank.

The men, travelling in a sport model automobile, entered the bank and separated, one going to the teller's window, where Bossow was stationed; one to the window of Eddy branch manager, and one staying near the janitor, who was sweeping near the door. The man at Bossow's window asked for a dollar's worth of pennies and as the bookkeeper started to count them out he swung a gun above the counter with the words, "put 'em up." At the same time a second robber drew a sawed-off shotgun from his overcoat and backed the janitor

Bossow, instead of following orders, dropped and pressed the alarm buttons, one of which sounded a big gong outside the door. The robber fired as Bossow started to drop but the bullet struck the glass, which is three quarters of an inch thick, and bullet proof. The gong uproar frightened them and they ran. The bullet hole in the glass was directly in line with Bossow's heart. There were no no customers in the bank at the time.
