Robert Cade, congratulated the brethren on the approach of another Conference, and that in the Providence of God they had been permitted to meet again face to face in the flesh. The closing year had been one of solemn and suggestive interest. Death had invaded our ministry and taken, in the prime of life and midst of his usefulness, Bro. W. Cooper, from his pulpit and charge forever. But it was a consolation to those for whom his doctrines were taught in the pulpit sustained him, when heart and flesh failed. The Revs. A. Augur, W. Thornley, J. Stonehouse, A. Griffith were received into full connection. The following ministers were on the reserve list: J. Sinclair, W. Stonehouse, J. Foulger, and J. Mattinly. The Rev. Wm. Cadville's resignation was accepted, he having changed his views on baptism, and taken charge of a Baptist Church in the United States. Revs. Thomas Dudley and R. Augur, on account of illness requested to be left without status for the next year, which was granted. A mission was established in London, East (Hamilton Road) by the London Circuit, on application of that Circuit. It is taken under the care of the General Missionary Committee. A Committee was appointed to take into consideration the whole of the circumstances connected with the Theological Institute, and report to the Conference. The Rev. R. Cade, the Spring President, preached the Conference sermon in the evening, the church being well filled.
