**A NEW UNIFORM BILL OF LADING**

Has Been Adopted by the Grand Trunk Railway.

Shippers are greatly interested in the new uniform bill of lading which the Grand Trunk recently decided to adopt. The bill is in two parts, as follows:

1. One form for use in connection with what are termed "straight" consignments, consisting of the bill of lading, shipping order and memorandum acknowledgment.

2. One form for "order" shipments, consisting of the order paper uniform bill of lading (to be printed only on yellow paper). This form shall be used only for order consignments. It will not be permissible to accept order shipments on straight bills of lading.

A supply of these standard forms will be furnished all shippers on request.

Crumlin Residents Are Up in Arms Against Nocturnal Gallopers.

Two unknown drunken men driving a team terrorized the citizens of Crumlin, several miles east of here, for several hours Tuesday night, and several cases of broken fences and gates are said to have resulted.

The two men apparently were bent on scaring the people, for they drove up and down through the place yelling and driving at full speed.

Once a loud crash was heard, and it later developed that the hilarious midnight visitors had run into and broken a gate leading into one of the houses.

The Crumlin people are up in arms over having been kept awake practically all night and will, it is said, give the midnight visitors a warm reception on another occasion.

**LECTURE ON HISTORY OF CIVILIZATION**

Earl Barnes Last Night Addressed a Large Audience in St. Andrew's Hall.

The first of a series of lectures on "The History of Civilization," was given by Earl Barnes, under the auspices of the London Froebel Society, in St. Andrew's lecture-room last evening before a large and appreciative audience.

Mr. Barnes took as his subject last night, "Oriental Beginnings, Workers and Dreamers," in which he discussed the earliest races known to be civilized. Mr. Barnes gave a most interesting account of what is known of the early history of the Egyptian peoples, who dwelt along the Nile.

The work of archaeologists is continually adding to the knowledge we have of these people, and the lecturer discussed the life of the ancients as it is shown by the remains unearthed. The tribes that dwelt along the Tigris and Euphrates Rivers are best known among the ancient peoples after the Egyptians. The writings that are extant show that the Egyptians had good systems of government, and the same seems to be true of many of the other early peoples, although, perhaps, in a lesser degree.

The Egyptians were a people of some account long before the Jews had risen to any great prominence in the world's affairs, but they gradually gave way before the rising power of the Jews, and the Jews take their place as the leading nation. In speaking of the Jews today, Mr. Barnes stated that no nation had ever been so widely scattered, and in many cities of the world there are more Jews than there are in all Palestine.

Rev. Dr. Ross, of St. Andrew's Church, presided, and conveyed to Mr. Barnes a hearty vote of thanks for his interesting lecture.

**LATE GEORGE E. BRASHER**

Sudden Death of a Former Mayor of Tillsonburg.

Ex-Mayor George E. Brasher, one of Tillsonburg's best-known and most respected citizens, died very suddenly on Thursday.

Mr. Brasher had for twenty years been one of the town's most prominent merchants. He was a member of the town council, and had also occupied the office of mayor. He was a member of the Anglican Church, and a staunch Liberal in politics.

Up until Saturday Mr. Brasher had apparently been in his usual health, and on that day visited Vienna, where he was taken suddenly ill with heart trouble. He was brought home to Tillsonburg, and lingered until yesterday morning, when death overtook him.

Mr. Brasher was in his 68th year. Four brothers survive him, William, John, Vienna, Edward, New Ontario, and Fred, of Burk's Falls. H. G. Caulfield, well-known wholesale merchant, of Toronto, is a brother-in-law.
