Two Celebrations in Which the Children Will Take Part—Changes in the Teaching Staff.

The regular semi-monthly meeting of the Public School Board was held last evening with the following members present: President, W. D. McPherson in the chair; Mrs. Dr. Stowe Guller, Mrs. McDonald, Mrs. Harrison, Messrs. Kent, Hagerman, Roden, Baird, Fisher, Weston, R. T. McPherson, Douglas, Clarke, Ogden, Hamble, Lee, Kerr, Hodgson, Reid and Jenkinson.

Communications were read from James L. Hughes, secretary of the Parliament Oration Celebration Committee, inviting the School Board to attend the commemorative exercises in the Park on Saturday next, and asking that the board allow each public school children to attend the exercises in the Park on the occasion; and from W. B. McMurrich, school solicitor, stating that it was his opinion that it was desirable that the board should take steps forthwith for the holding of a new election to fill the vacancies at present existing.


