



Applications for, rams and boars, a large number of which have already been received, should be made at an early date, as it will not be possible to consider, those that are not made prior to October 1st. Farmers desiring to secure the services of such stock should arrange to organize an associ- ation in their district and forward their application to the Live Stock Commissioner, Department of Agri- culture, Ottawa, from whom appli- culture, other favourable action which pure bred sires are distributed, may be obtained.
