WO relations have been published of this voyage, the one anonymous, in Dutch, printed at DORT in 1728, 4to. reprinted 1758; the other in German, at LEIPSICK, 1738; of it a French translation was published at the HAGUE in 1739, in 2 vols. 12mo. This last was by CHARLES FREDERICK BEHRENS, a native of MECKLENBURGH, serie and of the troops aboard the squadrop. I have not seen the German original, the French translation is therefore followed: it is a very poor performance, written with much ignorance, though with the parade of knowledge. The author of the Lives of the Governors of Batavia fays, the original journal, which he had in his possible, is very consistent to the Hague relation; but the only place whose fituation he mentions, is $1\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$. different in latitude, and double that in longitude, from the HAGUE publication: his affertion is therefore no testimony in its behalf.
