**T**WO relations have been published of this voyage, the one *anonymous*, in *Dutch*, printed at DORT in 1728, 4to. reprinted 1758; the other in German, at LEIPSICK, 1738; of it a French translation was published at the HAGUE in 1739, in 2 vols. 12mo. This last was by CHARLES FREDERICK BEHRENS, a native of MECKLENBURGH, serjeant of the troops aboard the *squadron*. I have not seen the *German* original, the French translation is therefore followed: it is a very poor performance, written with much ignorance, though with the parade of knowledge. The author of the *Lives of the Governors of Batavia* says, the original journal, which he had in his possession, is very consonant to the *Hague relation*; but the only place whose situation he mentions, is  $1\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$ . different in latitude, and double that in longitude, from the HAGUE publication: his *assertion* is therefore no testimony in its behalf.
