

**Scott's 58th.** The 1898 edition of Scott's Standard Catalogue has reached us for review.

It is a very valuable handbook giving the date issue, color, shape and value of any postage stamp ever issued. It contains over 600 pages and also gives hints for collectors, tables, in English, French and German of the technical terms used in philatelic catalogues; coin table giving approximate value of foreign coins in U. S. gold.
