from nearly every section of the United States. Iñability to fill orders owing to searcity of dry stock has curlailed the volume of busimess in cardabed the volnme of busimess in
some markets, notably fonavatada and buffalo, which have experienced a lively demand from the cast. Iligher prices are being asked for selects amd uppers, whil No. 2 cuts and bether are seareer than for some time. Buyers in the cast are willing to pay slightly advanced prices, a condition whet has greatly muruted the out look, as for some tume past it has been almost impossible for dealers to place lumber there at a reasemable profit. In Wisconsin special activity is noted in Norway, whach has recent ly undergone an advance. In the Saginaw valley log run pinc is quoted at Sis to $\$ 32$, hut sume choice lots have been sold at $\$ 3.4$. 3ox lumber sells at $\$_{15}$ and mill culls at $\$ 12$ to \$12.50.
