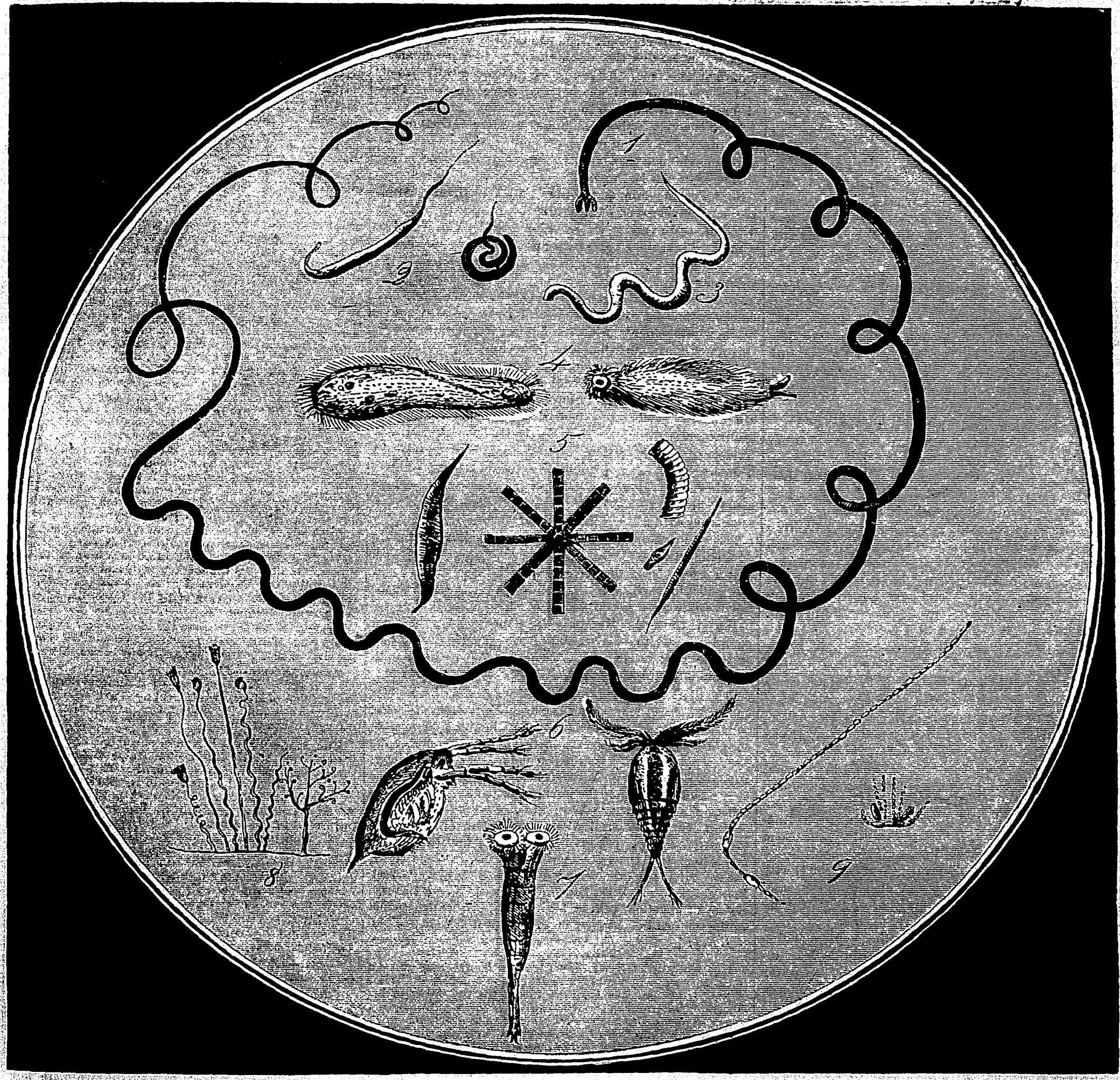
The water supplied to the public of Montreal is not the pure and simple element some innocent people suppose
