His Excellency Ali Bengelloun today presented his Letters of Credence as Ambassador Extraordinary and Plenipotentiary of Morocco to Canada.

The ceremony took place at Government House at 11:00 a.m. The Chief of Protocol, Mr. Henry F. Davis, presented the Ambassador to His Excellency the Governor-General. Mr. G.P. de T. Glazebrook, Assistant Under-Secretary of State for External Affairs and Mr. Esmond Butler, Secretary to the Governor-General, were in attendance on the Governor-General on this occasion.

The Ambassador was accompanied by Mr. M. Britel, Attaché.

Mr. Bengelloun, a lawyer by profession, is a specialist in Constitutional and Administrative Law. He was appointed to the Supreme Court of Morocco in 1957 and Ambassador to the United States of America in 1962.

Mr. Bengelloun is married. He will continue to reside in Washington.
