The House met again into Committee of Ways and Means.

(In the Committee.)

The following Resolutions were adopted :-

- 1. Resolved, That towards making good the Supply granted to Her Majesty for the financial year ending 30th June, 1881, the sum of \$1,214,328.25 be granted out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund of Canada.
- 2. Resolved, That towards making good the Supply granted to Her Majesty for the financial year ending 30th June, 1882, the sum of \$27,082,257.66 be granted out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund of Canada.

Resolutions to be reported.

The said Resolutions were accordingly reported, read a second time, and concurred in;—and Committee to sit again, to morrow.

Sir Leonard Tilley then introduced a Bill No. 104, for granting to Her Majesty certain sums of money required for defraying certain expenses of the public service, for the financial years ending respectively the 30th June, 1881, and the 30th June, 1882, and for other purposes relating to the public service; which was read the first, a second and third time, and passed.

In accordance with the Order of the House, the Bill No. 106 to authorize the raising by way of loan of certain sums of money required for the public service, was read a third time, and passed.

Sir John A. Macdonald laid before The House,—Report of the Civil Service Commission, and Appendix with the Evidence in full.

A Message was received from the Senate, with the following Bill No. 107 of their own, intituled: "An Act in amendment of the Acts respecting Steamboats, to which the concurrence of this House was desired.

On motion of Sir John A. Macdonald, the said Bill was read the first, and a second time, considered in Committee of the Whole, reported, read a third time, and passed.

The House then adjourned until to-morrow, at Three o'clock, P. M.
