My dear Sir Arthur,

I am enclosing you copy of a letter received from Mr. Geoffrey Whiskard. Mr. Mayhew called on me this morning and discussed the purpose of his mission to the West Indies.

There is a growing interest in this Country in the problem of higher education for the West Indian youth, and Mr.

Mayhew was anxious to know if there was any objection on the part of the authorities or prejudice in the minds of the student body against West Indian students attending Canadian Universities.

I told him that so far as my observations had gone I felt warranted in saying that these students would be welcomed at Canadian Universities, particularly those in Eastern Canada.

Mr. Mayhew has never been in Canada and knows very little about our educational institutions. He sails direct from here to the Barbadoes next week. I suggested to him that I would write you and Sir Robert Falconer asking you both to send the University Report and whatever other information you may be able to give him
