throughout the year to two and a half subjects, namely the subjects in which they have failed and one subject from the next higher year is to offer them only a half year of work, and to compel them to leave the College is obviously unfair. I have tried, therefore, as hitherto, to decide these cases on their individual merits. There are also a few students who were ill during the examination period last May and after who have been permitted to take their examinations for the first time partly in Deptember and partly in February. All other registrations have, I think, complied strictly with the written rules of the Faculty.

This report is intended wholly for the information of the Faculty and calls, I think, for no further proceedings except informal suggestion and comment.
