THE SENATE OF CANADA

BILL D.

An Act for the relief of Marie Louise Rossetti Di Rosa.

Preamble.

WHEREAS Marie Louise Rossetti Di Rosa, residing at the city of Sudbury, in the province of Ontario, waitress, wife of Antonio Di Rosa, machine shop foreman, who is domiciled in Canada and residing at the city of Montreal, in the province of Quebec, has by her petition 5 alleged that they were married on the twenty-seventh day of November, A.D. 1913, at the said city of Montreal, she then being Marie Louise Rossetti, a spinster; and whereas by her petition she has prayed that, because of his adultery since then, their marriage be dissolved; and whereas the 10 said marriage and adultery have been proved by evidence adduced and it is expedient that the prayer of her petition be granted: Therefore His Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Senate and House of Commons of Canada, enacts as follows:—

Marriage dissolved.

1. The said marriage between Marie Louise Rossetti and Antonio Di Rosa, her husband, is hereby dissolved, and shall be henceforth null and void to all intents and purposes whatsoever.

Right to marry again.

2. The said Marie Louise Rossetti may at any time 20 hereafter marry any man whom she might lawfully marry if the said marriage with the said Antonio Di Rosa had not been solemnized.
