The Defence of the Realm Act, pass-The Defence of the Realm Act, passed at the outbre k of the war, gave the government power to take and exercise control over works where war materials were being actually made. David Lloyd George, the chancellor of the exchequer, on behalf of the government, today asked that the control of manufactories be extended to works which were capable of being used for hich were capable of being used for

This power was unanimously granted, altho Andrew Bonar Law; leader of the opposition, described the measure as "probably the most drastic ever laid before parliament."

This step on the part of the government came as "counties and the government came as "counties and the step."

This step on the part of the government came as a complete surprise, altho David Lloyd George, in a speech at Bangor last week, emphasized the importance of increasing the output of war munitions which labor disputes at that time threatened to diminish.

Now the workers in the engineering trade will be in the position of public servants, and the government hopes that this fact will impress them with the importance of keeping up the supplies for which the armies and navies of the allied powers largely depend upon this country.

SYNOPSIS OF CANADIAN NORTH.

V.EST LAND REGULATIONS.

The soic head or a tainity, or any male over eighteen years old, may homestead a quarter-section of available Dominion land in l'anjtoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta. Applicant must appear in person at the Dominion Lands Agency or Sub-Agency for the district. Entry by proxy may be made at any Dominion Lands Agency (but not Sub-Agency) on certain conditions.

Duties—Six months' residence upon and cultivation of the land in each of three years. A homesteader may live within nine miles of his homestead on a farm of at least eighty acres, on certain conditions. A habitable house is required, except where residence is performed in the vicinity.

In certain districts a homesteader in good standing may pre-empt a quarter-section alongside his homestead. Price, \$3.00 per acre.

Duties—Six months' residence in each of three years after earning homestead patent; also fifty acres extra cultivation. Pre-emption patent may be obtained as soon as homestead patent, on certain conditions.




