luable Colonies, as near nine-tenths of their exports are the produce of the fisheries on their own coasts, were the carriage of this produce to market to be folely in British ships.

More than half the export of the New England Colonies is the produce of their fisheries, but the reason why disadvantageous to us is, this produce is that of fisheries distant from them, which the Parent-state might carry on to advantage. As to the fisheries on their own coast they are the best situated to carry them on, and it would be unreasonable, as well as impolitic, to prevent them.

It would be equally fo, not to fuffer them to carry on the whale or other fiflieries wherein every other power has a right to fifth as well as ourselves. All is, they should be confined to these, and then, if we have the carriage of their produce to market, neither party can

have just reason to complain.
