Be it therefore enacted, by the authority of the Municipal Council of the Township of London, that from and after the passing of this by-law, it shall not be lawful for any person to open or keep any house for the purpose above mentioned, within the limits of the Township aforesaid, without having first received and obtained a License under the seal of the Municipal Council, of the Township aforesaid, authorising the opening of such house for the sale or disposal of such article as above described.

And be it further enacted, that any person, or persons, who having obtained a License, authorising the opening of any house for the purposes above mentioned, shall at all times keep such house in a quist, proper and orderly manner, suffering no species of gambling, drunkenness, tippling, profane swearing, or any improper conduct whatsoever to be practised, in or about any such house, outhouse, or premises thereunto belonging ; nor shall any such house be kept open on Sabbath day, for the sale or disposal of any meat, drink, or anything whatsoever (unless to strangers travelling,) and to such only, as far as necessity requires ; And be it further enacted, that any person wishing to obtain a License, for any house as above described, shall be required to obtain a cortificate of character, and of the necessary. accommodation, signed by at least six resident landholders, nearest to where such house is required to be opened; which certificate shall be countersigned by the Councillor representing the Ward in which such house is situate, and upon presenting such certificate to the Township Clerk, and paying the said Clerk, for township purposes, the sum of two pounds currency. The party applying shall be s. aces so preate he .

And be it further enacted, that any person, or persons, violating any of the provisions of this By-Law, shall be subject to punishment by fine, or imprisonment, provided no greater fine than five pounds be inflicted, or imprisonment for any greater period than twenty days; And be it further enacted, that any prosecution to be brought against any party, for any contravention of this By-Law, shall be commenced within thirty days after the alleged offence has been committed; complaint to be entered before the nearest resident Magistrate, whose duty it stall be to pay one half of all fines imposed under this By-Law to the prosecutor, and the remainder to the Township Treasurer, to form part of the fund of the Township atoresaid, for the improvement of roads and bridges.
