Dun's Trade Review.

The New Year's week at Montreal is always a dull one in wholesale and manufacturing circles, the more especially as the French-Canadian operatives plan for an extended merrymaking, extending to Epipiany, or Old Christmas, and there is little of an interesting character to note at the moment. Travelers are all getting out on their routes again, and a good spring business appears to be expected in all lines. Merchandise values continue to rule very firm in the majority of cases. Sugar is the prominent exception, and prices of rolled oats are weaker owing to reported probable disruption of the combine.

The wholesale trade in Toronto continues very quiet. The unusually open season has militated against the movement of heavy goods, but some houses in this particular trade say that stocks are not excessive. Many travelers have returned to their trips, and they report prospects good. The markets for staple lines of drygoods, are firm. Payments are fairly satisfactory, but the renewals asked for this month are more numerous than in January of last year. In groceries, the volume of trade is only moderate; prices of sugars and canned goods continue steady. Metals are firm with demand fair, while shelf hardware remains in active. Hides are lower this week, and butter and cheese firm on light supplies. The grain trade is very quiet, while prices of wheat are firm. In the district for the week seven failures were reported.
