Edward Coppling, building inspector and chief of the staff of the City Commissioner, entered the service of the city on April 22, 1874. He was appointed under clause 1 of Bylaw No. 427, for regulating the erection of buildings and the storage of inflammable material.

The issue of building permits has dwindled to a low ebb. Complaint is made by many intending builders that the very high prices of building materials and the continued talk of threatened strikes among bricklayers has caused them to change their minds.
