OTTAWA, March 26.—Answering a question in the House of Commons today, the minister of militia stated that he had no information in Canada as to whether or not Canadian soldiers were being made use of for police duty in Ireland, with a view to preventing a Sinn Féin insurrection. But a cable query had been sent overseas for the desired information.

BODIES OF CANADIANS WILL BE BROUGHT FROM SIBERIA WHERE POSSIBLE

OTTAWA, March 26.—Provision is made in an order-in-council to return to Canada, when possible, the bodies of those members of the Canadian forces who have died on duty in Siberia. The order, which was made in the House of Commons, provides that the remains of Canadian soldiers who have died in Siberia, in the line of duty, shall be brought home, if possible, and buried in Canada.

STRIKES IN SPAIN. London, March 26.—A wireless dispatch from Madrid says that strikes have been declared in various towns, including Valencia and Alcoy. Agitations are in progress in Madrid and Coruna. The censorship, put into operation yesterday, forbids the publication of strike news, labor troubles and the movement of troops.

OTTAWA, March 26.—After sneaking little bits of news in the budget and the speech from the throne, the government today passed, total amount of \$1,000,000, for the proposed extension of the normal schools.

E. B. Devlin and Dr. Edwards rose to their feet at once. Mr. Devlin said he would move a resolution if he intended to withdraw his resolution, but the member from Frontenac said he had no intention of withdrawing his resolution.

Mr. C. G. Power of Quebec South, then moved the adjournment of the debate. After a short discussion, the House adjourned.

At 6 o'clock the House adjourned until tomorrow.

The matter will come up again on the next private members' day.

Department of Health. Hon. W. J. Howland introduced a bill to create a federal department of public health. The bill would provide for the appointment of a minister of the crown, and the usual provisions are made for the appointment of a deputy minister, and the necessary officers and staff.

The powers of the minister of public health will extend to and include all matters and questions relating to the promotion and preservation of the health and social welfare of the people of the country.

The bill also provided for the creation of a Dominion Council of Public Health. The deputy minister of the department would be chairman. The council would consist of the minister of the crown, and the usual executive officer of each provincial department or board of health, with three members to be named by the governor-in-council.

During question time in the Commons this afternoon Mr. McMillan informed Hon.
