

## DEATH OF MRS. LUDWIG A PURE ACCIDENT, SAYS CORONER'S JURY

Riders of Two Auto Cycles Are  
Exonerated From All  
Blame.

KITCHENER, Nov. 3.—The coroner's jury investigating the death of Mrs. Ludwig, who was fatally injured on Saturday night when struck by a runaway motorcycle, returned a verdict late tonight declaring that the fatality was a pure accident and exonerating William Schaefer and Walter Hauser, the collision of whose auto-cycles caused the accident, from all blame.

Twenty witnesses were heard, and as a result of the evidence the jury expressed the opinion that, while Hauser, who was arrested following

the accident, was drunk at the time of his arrest it did not follow that he was intoxicated when riding the cycle. The arrest was not made till an hour or more after the accident.

The evidence went to show that both cycles were proceeding at a slow speed when they came into collision, which resulted in one of the machines stalling. An expert declared that the jar caused by the collision would have the effect of throwing the throttle of the stalled cycle open, thereby setting it out on its fatal career.

## BECK PREDICTS MUCH ADDITIONAL POWER IN YEAR

Tells Elgin and Norfolk Deputations Cannot Take  
Over Road.

TORONTO, Nov. 3.—Sir Adam Beck told a deputation from Norfolk County and East Elgin here this afternoon that "next September there will be 100,000 additional horsepower available; the following September, 275,000 available; and before another September there will be about 200,000 additional horsepower available, and we will have on the Canadian side of Niagara Falls an installed capacity of 925,000 horsepower."

The chairman of the Ontario Hydro-Electric Power Commission intimated that ultimately there might be 3,000,000 horsepower developed, of which 1,500,000 might be developed from Niagara Falls, another 1,000,000 horsepower from the St. Lawrence River, and the remaining 500,000 horsepower from other sources. All this power, he said, would be utilized for general industrial purposes, and for railways and for lighting.

The deputation waited on Sir Adam to urge that the railway line be taken from Port Dover to Simcoe and Port Rowan to be connected up with the London and Port Stanley Railway.

Sir Adam replied that the hydro commission had not the authority to do this. The commission's authority had been blocked by statute, he said, so far as expending money for any purpose connected with railway undertakings was concerned. He said, however, that the commission could negotiate with the Government with a view to securing running rights on the line in question, not to purchase it.

## "FULL CONTROL OR RESIGN," SAYS MOUSSEAU

Windsor Inspector Puts Ulti-  
matum Up To Legislature  
Committee.

**SPRACKLIN TELLS STORY**  
Parson Says Hallam Brothers  
Were "Good Producers"  
While On Job.

TORONTO, Nov. 3.—Both Chief  
License Inspector Mousseau of Win-  
dward and Rev. J. O. L. Spracklin of  
Sandwich, special license inspectors,  
appeared this afternoon before the  
special committee of the Legislature  
which is investigating the working of  
the Ontario temperance act, and told  
of their work and worries along the  
border in hunting down rum-runners  
and other violators of the act.

Inspector Mousseau complained of  
divided authority between Mr. Spracklin  
and himself, and stated that if he  
were not a special license inspector he  
would resign. Mr. Spracklin declared  
that he did not want the "miserable  
job," even at \$10,000 a year, unless he  
had the entire confidence of those in  
authority over him.

Chief Inspector Mousseau admitted  
that conditions had improved since  
Mr. Spracklin was appointed inspector,  
but he would not say the improve-  
ment was due entirely to Mr. Spracklin.  
A good officer, he said, would not  
do too much use of his gun. Mousseau  
publicly gave credit to Mr. Spracklin  
for his efforts, but did not blame Mr. Spracklin  
for the trouble. He said he was sur-  
prised and shocked at the large num-  
ber of farmers engaged in illegal liquor  
traffic. He used blarney search war-  
rants, he said, and had given some to  
Spracklin, but to no one else.

Complaint had been made, he said,  
that Spracklin had secured blank war-  
rants from a magistrate and had per-  
mitted officers under his direction to  
use them. Mousseau said that he had  
Spracklin's efforts in trying to stamp  
out illicit liquor traffic, was that the  
minister was earnest and sincere, and  
that he had done more than he had  
been given credit for. He said there was  
divided responsibility. He had no  
control over Spracklin, he said, and  
stated that he should by virtue of his  
office.

**SPRACKLIN TELLS STORY.**  
TORONTO, Nov. 3.—Rev. J. O. L.  
Spracklin, special license inspector in  
the Windsor district, this afternoon  
told the special committee of the Legis-  
lature, which is investigating the work-  
ings of the Ontario temperance act, the  
story of his campaign against rum-  
runners, bootleggers and keepers of  
blind pigs. He said he had been at  
the work since July, and had been  
blamed for many things that he knew  
nothing about until he saw them in the  
papers.

During his recital, Mr. Spracklin  
asked for protection from the commit-  
tee for his campaign, intimating that  
he might be incriminating or cause  
libel suit. He was promised protec-  
tion. Mr. Spracklin said that the road-  
side liquor houses, where illegal  
liquor business appeared to be running  
without restriction when he entered  
upon his duties as license inspector, and  
he said that as many as six loads of  
liquor passed his home every day.

He told of having tried to get the  
town council of Sandwich to take ac-  
tion to put a stop to drunkenness in  
that town, but the council turned the  
matter over to the police committee,  
and the latter investigated with the  
local police was a farce, which Rev.  
Mr. Spracklin refused to recognize. He  
had endeavored to co-operate with  
License Inspector Mousseau, and the  
license department, but they had been  
view to stopping the illicit business  
in the hotels and the run-running.

Inspector Spracklin said that on one  
occasion when he and his men stopped  
a big motor car, one of the occupants  
said he was a provincial officer and  
showed his badge to substantiate this.  
This officer afterwards apologized. On  
the night in question he had been at  
Mr. Spracklin and threatened to report  
him to Chief Provincial Constable  
Rogers.

There was only one shooting affair.  
Spracklin said, and on that occasion  
the party had been in self-defence. S.  
M. Hallam was with him at the time.  
After Hallam's dismissal, he, Mr.  
Spracklin, had to shoot at the stairs.  
Lack of Co-ordination.  
Mr. Spracklin was asked by a mem-  
ber of the committee if there had not  
been lack of co-ordination between him  
and Mr. Mousseau. He replied that he  
would not say that, but some organiza-  
tions had been of no use to him. The  
Hallam brothers were "good producers,"  
Mr. Spracklin said in answer to a ques-  
tion from Major J. C. Toimie. "We got  
\$20,000 in fines from August 23 to the  
end of October, and fourteen cases are  
still to be disposed of," Mr. Spracklin  
said.

Asked if he ever carried blank search  
warrants Mr. Spracklin replied that  
every officer in the department carried  
them. He did not think it possible to  
enforce the Ontario temperance act  
without blank warrants, as a house-full  
of liquor might be conveyed across the  
border, while the Ontario temperance  
act officers were on several miles to  
get a warrant. He denied a story that  
he had stopped motor cars coming from  
church.

## GLASGOW VOTE SHOWS VICTORY FOR 'WET' FORCE

Only 94 Licenses Will Be  
Cancelled Out of 1,600  
in City.

GLASGOW, Nov. 3.—(Canadian As-  
sociated Press.) Official results in Glas-  
gow of the liquor option poll shows a  
comparative victory for the "wets."  
Four wards voted "dry"; nine for limited  
licenses and 24 for no change, which  
means that 94 licenses will be can-  
celled through the city out of a total  
of 1,600.

The "dry" wards are Whiteinch, Cath-  
cart, Pollokshields, and Camphill.  
In Dennistoun prohibition was de-  
feated by four votes. Practically all the  
working class areas remain "wet" and  
also the central city districts.

Aberdeen voted "wet" by 2 to 1. Other  
towns voting "no change" were Hawick,  
Dalkeith, Auchtermuchtie, Paulkland,  
Arbroath, Montrose, Tayport, Kerrie-  
muir, St. Andrews, Alos, Girvan and  
Stonehaven.

**ONLY THREE "DRY."**  
London, Nov. 3.—(By the Canadian  
Press.)—Up to midnight three areas in  
Scotland in which voting took place yes-  
terday on local option had polled dry  
votes, Stirling, a whaling sound, Gre-  
y, and Killybeg, and Kirkintilloch  
mining centres. Fourteen other sec-  
tions voted for no change. They in-  
cluded Grangemouth, Bridge of Allan,  
Dunoon, Lanark, Helensburgh, Barr-  
head, Bonnybrigg, Lowhead and Stirling.

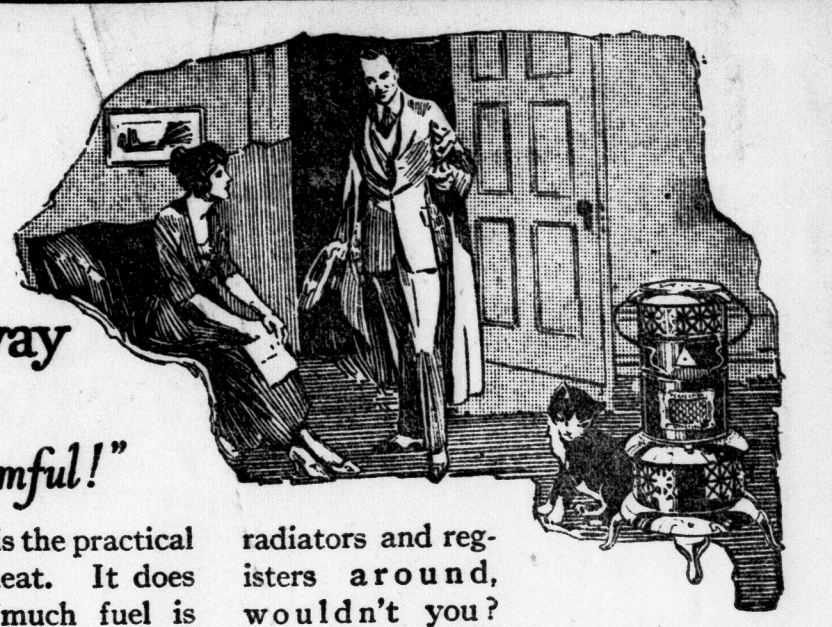

## EFFORT TO HARNESS POWER IN PYRENEES

HERIDA, Spain, Nov. 1.—Efforts to  
harness the waterpower going to waste  
in the Pyrenees and transform it into  
electricity are being intensified. Engi-  
neers have surveyed the entire moun-

tain range, and have succeeded already  
in controlling many torrents and mak-  
ing them furnish power. Altogether  
300,000-horsepower now is furnished and  
capital amounting to 300,000,000 pesetas  
has been invested. Every day sees ad-  
ditions to the amount of power available  
and engineers employed in the work  
estimate that in a few years Catalonia  
will be able to do without coal.

**GOLD HOARDERS HARD HIT.**

gold coinage is no longer good for cir-  
culation. The move was made to com-  
pel them to exchange their gold for  
new currency.

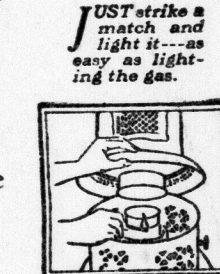
