Payment of principal and interest on loans from Canada due after March 31, 1974, has been deferred until March 31, 1979, in accordance with Orders in Council P.C. 1974-633, P.C. 1974-704 and P.C. 1974-856. Interest on repayments deferred by order in council is accrued in a memo account held by the Secretariat of State and not recorded in the Accounts of Canada. The applicable rate of interest on the 31 loans on which repayment is deferred varies from 5¼ p. 100 to 8½ p. 100. The cumulative interest since March 31, 1974, not recorded in the Accounts of Canada, is \$42,159,582 of which \$14,053,194 is the interest for the year.

NUMBER OF PERSONS UNDER CONTRACT TO NATIONAL ARTS CENTRE

Question No. 228—Mr. McKenzie:

1. What is the total number of persons under contract to the National Arts Centre and how many are retired public servants?
2. What was the total amount in (a) 1975 (b) 1976 paid to those under contract and how much of this was to retired public servants?

Hon. John Roberts (Secretary of State): 1. There are 111 persons under contract to the National Arts Centre and, of this number, none are retired public servants.

2. Contractual employees engaged by the National Arts Centre during 1975 and 1976 did not include any retired public servants and total amounts paid were \$1,078,086 and \$1,084,791 for those years respectively.

3. By province, what was the (a) average hourly rate paid to employment agencies (b) average hourly rate paid to employees (c) total amount paid by the Bureau of Intellectual Property in (i) 1975 (ii) 1976?

Mr. Alan Martin (Parliamentary Secretary to Minister of Consumer and Corporate Affairs): 1. (a) (i) British Columbia, Nil; (ii) Alberta, Nil; (iii) Saskatchewan, Nil; (iv) Manitoba, Nil; (v) Ontario, five employees (three employees for periods ranging from two days to three weeks and two employees for periods exceeding three weeks); (vi) Quebec, six employees (for periods ranging from two days to one week); (vii) New Brunswick, Nil; (viii) Nova Scotia, Nil; (ix) Prince Edward Island, Nil; (x) Newfoundland, Nil.
